Interrelate

Galston Public School have kindly invited us to join them for their interrelate session on the 1st June 2021. Please see the note attached. Interrelate has the acknowledgement of government, education and health authorities to provide relationship education in schools. They have been teaching sexuality and relationship education to young people and their parents for over 90 years and have a reputation for non-discriminatory and open teaching on sensitive issues.

The highly-trained and skilled educators deliver a range of programs that assist more than 90,000 children and parents each year to communicate with each other about fundamental emotional and social development issues. The objective is to ensure young people know the range of possible consequences of relationships and assist in help-seeking behaviour. Research shows that if young people are given accurate and reliable information, they are more able to make good choices.

Late Arrivals

All students who arrive at school after 9am are considered late. They must go to the office and have their time and reason recorded. They cannot go straight to class. It is vital that students arrive at school on time.

- It ensures the students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day.
- It helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine.
- It gives students time to greet their friends before class.
- It reduces classroom disruption.

Normally we would ask that parents accompany them to the office, but due to Covid restrictions this is not happening at the moment. Our Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO) was at school last Tuesday and has recorded student attendance patterns and students arriving late.

Permission Notes

Our letter box in the office foyer for student permission notes and payments is back in use, after having a sabbatical due to covid.. Please make sure if you are paying in cash or cheque that these payments are returned with permission notes in a sealed labelled envelope and placed in the letter box at the office. Although we will accept cash, we do prefer it if payments can be made using the online pop system.

Annual Records Update

Thank you to families for completing your student records so that in an emergency valuable time is not lost in trying to contact you. If you have not yet returned this information please do so as soon as possible.

Student fees

Our school operates on a very tight budget. Each year the school buys textbooks at a discounted price rather than sending parents out with a list to purchase over the school holidays. This system works very well as all children are guaranteed to have the same resources. However, when parents do not pay their school fees this does have a knock on effect, as the school does not have money to purchase other classroom resources. The school does not receive money from the Department of Education to pay for these books, and we therefore are left looking for money to fund other resources, or we have to go without. Continual non-payments will see us have to review this procedure and put the onus back on parents to purchase supplies. Payment plans are available to help ease the pressure, so please contact the office if needed.



Ooshies 4 maths

If anyone has any spare ooshies they no longer want we would love to have them at school. We are having a push on maths resources and they are not cheap and we thought a great way to reuse and recycle ooshies would be to use them as maths counters. Please drop them off at the office so they can be sanitised over the holidays to be used next term as maths resources.

Book Sale.

As part of book week next term our captains are planning a book sale. Over the holidays if you are having a clear out please consider keeping any unwanted books to the side and bringing them to school next term for their sale.

<u>Hats</u>

It is vitally important that every student has their own school hat every day and wears it correctly. We have a large amount of students chewing on the hat string and letting it hang. This is becoming a concern as last week a child got his hat caught on a piece of equipment. Parents can you please cut the string off your child's hat.

Pedestrian safety.

We want to keep every pedestrian and driver safe around our school, but we need your help to do so. Please be aware of what all of your children are doing outside of the school. Do not let children walk onto the roadside to get into the car, ensure children get into the car safely from the pavement side.

Please also take note of our neighbours driveways- especially near the Annangrove Autos entrance- cars do not stop coming out of these entrances just because it is pick up or drop off time. Do not let your children run ahead of you and straight over these entrances.

<u>'Intention to apply for Year 5 entry to an opportunity class in 2022'</u> For metropolitan/regional applicants

Dear Parent/Carer,

Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and high potential students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. Successful students will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6.

Testing and assessment

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the combined results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. Students who wish to be considered for opportunity class placement will sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on **Wednesday 21 July 2021**.

How to apply

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2022, you need to apply between **Tuesday 20 April 2021** and **Friday 7 May 2021**. You will need to access the online application at: <u>https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5</u>. You must **not** use the child's email address.

If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after **Tuesday 20 April 2021**.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

Important – the school cannot apply on your behalf.
